

Quilted mat instructions



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6 Insert the mat. (Fig. 6) While holding the mat level, lightly insert it into the feed slot, and then press in the operation panel.

In the draw/cut selection screen, select "Cut", (Fig. (7))

Press the "Start/Stop" button |>/11 to start cutting.

When cutting is finished, press in the operation

panel to feed out the mat, and then use the included

spatula to peel off the pieces.

For details, refer to the Operation Manual.






The appliqué pieces are finished!





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
2 With right sides together, sew row 1 to row 2,

zigzagging from corner to corner, along the hexagon sides to be joined. At this stage, make sure that the corners of matching pieces do not become misaligned. Press the seams, folding the seam allowances over to one side. (Fig. 17)



3 Sew row 2 to row 3 in the same way.

Turn the fabric over to the right side, and then press it. (Fig. $\textcircled{\ensuremath{\mathbb{R}}}$)






Sew quilting.

Mark the quilting lines on the joined pieces. (Fig. (3)
At an angle 60° from the vertical, draw lines at 1.5 cm
intervals parallel to the hexagon edges.

(Draw marks using a chalk pencil, etc., so that they can easily be removed later.)




2) Baste the joined pieces and the quilt batting so they do not become misaligned.

Sew the quilting in the order ① through ⑤. (Fig. (**)) When an area without quilting is reached, sew reinforcement stitches to secure the stitching. Be sure to continue the quilting in the same direction. Sew carefully to avoid misaligned quilting. After stitching, press the seams.

* Optional attachment For best results, use a walking foot and quilter, etc.


Fixed sewing direction <





Attach the backing.

Measure the size of the hexagon piece, and then cut out the backing with a 0.7 cm seam allowance.
With right sides together, sew the top piece to the backing, leaving an opening. (Fig. (5))



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☆ Finishing

Touch up with an iron, and you are finished! (Fig. 1971)
