
# Tissue box cover instructions 🔊



#### Instructions

# \*Step 1

# Sew together the outside.

 With right sides together, sew top fabric A and top fabric B.
 Press the seams, folding the seam allowances over to one side.


Sew reverse stitches at the beginning and end of stitching.

2) Sew the braiding along the connecting seam. Press the seams.

#### Note

Sew reverse stitches at the beginning and end of stitching.

# \*Step 2

#### Sew together the top fabric and backing.

1) With right sides together, sew the top fabric and backing with a 1 cm seam allowance on each side. Press the seams, folding the seam allowances over to one side. Turn right side out, and then touch up with an iron.

#### Note

Sew reverse stitches at the beginning and end of stitching.


# \*Step3

#### Create the shape.

- 1) Mark 1 cm to the left and to the right of the centerline, and then fold to overlap 2 cm in the middle.
- 2 Pin to prevent misalignments, and then stitch 0.5 cm from the edge of the fabric. Do this at the top and at the bottom.

#### Note

Sew reverse stitches at the beginning and end of stitching.



# \*Step4

## Make the loop.

- 1 Use an iron to affix stabilizer to the loop fabric, and then fold as shown. Fold and tuck in only one end.
- 2) Stitch to secure it.

#### Note

Sew reverse stitches at the beginning and end of stitching.

3 Baste at the right end of the top piece.

#### Note

Sew reverse stitches at the beginning and end of stitching.

## \*Step 5

# Bind the edges.

- 1) Use an iron to affix stabilizer to the bias strip, and then fold as shown.
- ② Cover the top and bottom edges with the bias strips, and then secure with pins. Fold in the ends of the bias strips.
- 3 Stitch along the edge, and then press the seams. Do this at the top and at the bottom.


#### Note

Sew reverse stitches at the beginning and end of stitching.

4 Fold the loop up, and then stitch along the edge.






# \*Step6

## Finishing

- 1) Sew a buttonhole in one end of the loop. Sew the buttonhole according to the instructions provided with your sewing machine. Use a seam ripper to cut open the buttonhole.
- ② Sew the button to the left end of the top piece.
- 3 Touch up with an iron, and you are finished!!
