



Finish the sides.

① Turn the edges of the sides to the inside twice, and then stitch them.

Note

Sew reverse stitches at the beginning and end of stitching.

*Step2

Finish the top edge and hem.

1) Cover the top edge with bias tape, and then finish the seam allowance.

Decorate by sewing on lace.

Note

Sew reverse stitches at the beginning and end of stitching.

⁽²⁾ Cover the hem with bias tape, and then finish the seam allowance.

Fold the hern as shown in Fig. a to create a clean finish. Decorate by sewing on lace.

Note

Sew reverse stitches at the beginning and end of stitching.

★ Decorate as desired, using lace, braiding, etc.

*Step3

Attach the strings.

① Finish the back ties, armholes and neck tie with 1 piece of bias tape.

Leaving an extra 45 cm of tape, cover one armhole, leave 65 cm for the neck tie, and then cover the other armhole.

Fold the end of the tape as shown in Fig.a, and then deanly finish it.


Be careful that the bias tape is not stretched while it is sewn.

Note

Sew reverse stitches at the beginning and end of stitching.

★ Adjust the length of the apron and its strings according to the height of the child.



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*Step4

Attach the pocket.

1 Make the pocket.

Turn the opening of the pocket to the inside twice, and then stitch it

Note

Sew reverse stitches at the beginning and end of stitching.

(2) Turn backa 1 cm seam allowance on the other sides of the pocket (finish the edges of the seam allowances with overlock or zigzag stitching), and then decorate by sewing on lace.


Note

Sew reverse stitches at the beginning and end of stitching.

★ Decorate as desired, using lace, braiding, etc.

(3) Position on the apron as shown, and then stitch it.

Note Sew reverse stitches at the beginning and end of stitching.



*Finishing

Touch up with an iron, and you are finished!!
